No action, informational only. Staff will provide an update on the 2045 Transportation System Plan project.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY:

Project Overview: The purpose of this Policy Session is to update the Board on the project - Transportation System Plan Update: Looking ahead to 2045 (2045 TSP).

The Clackamas County Transportation System Plan (TSP) guides transportation-related decisions, identifies the transportation needs and priorities in unincorporated Clackamas County, reflects all relevant national, state and regional transportation and planning requirements, and provides policies, guidelines and projects to meet transportation needs for residents, businesses and visitors in unincorporated Clackamas County for the next 20 years – through 2045.

Clackamas County adopted its current TSP in January of 2014. Over the past 10 years, important changes have occurred in the requirements for TSP updates as identified in the Oregon Transportation Planning Rule (TPR), the Metro Regional Transportation Plan (RTP), in the plans impacting transportation facilities in the county, and in the populations that live and work in the county.

The TSP Update will be created in coordination with the County's cities, the State of Oregon, area transit providers, and other affected agencies and partners. The project will utilize comprehensive public engagement techniques including open houses, workshops, and surveys, and technical and advisory committee meetings to inform the project's development in addressing both urban and rural areas of the county. With the changes to the TPR focusing on how systems planning is conducted within metropolitan areas, this project will acknowledge and address the uniqueness of both urban and rural areas in the county.

This project is utilizing assistance from a team of consultants in addition to County staff. With the signing of the contract with the consulting team in June 2025, the project team began the initial background work. The project is expected to take approximately 18 months, concluding with adoption by the Board in early 2027. A graphic that outlines the project schedule is included in the presentation.

Engagement: An extensive public engagement strategy has been created to support the development of the 2045 TSP. It includes both a Technical Advisory Committee and a Public Advisory Committee (PAC). In addition, there will be several touchpoints with the community, including attending table and pop-up opportunities, online open houses, and in person community workshops for specific geographic areas. There will also be opportunities to update the Board, the Planning Commission and the Clackamas County Coordinating Committee throughout the project.

Important Work Ahead: A few of the key items currently underway are finalizing the 20-year financial forecast and reviewing existing plans that set the foundation for the projects that have already been identified as needed. There will then be engagement with the community and technical analysis to identify additional projects and programs that may be needed. Once the full set of projects have been identified, a prioritization process will occur that utilizes evaluation criteria, input from geographic subareas and PAC input.

There are some topics that have arisen since the last TSP update that we need to make sure are considered during this project. These include:

- Integration of the Safe Systems Approach
- Inclusion of recent work related to resilience, disaster management and emergency transportation routes
- Addressing Greenhouse Gas reductions and Zero Emissions vehicles
- Acknowledgement of recent tolling discussion and future project implications

- Transportation System Plan (TSP): Provides policies, guidelines and projects to meet transportation needs for residents, businesses and visitors in unincorporated Clackamas County for the next 20 years.
- Reflects all relevant national, state and regional transportation and planning requirements.
- Addresses both urban and rural areas of the county.
- Chapter 5 of the Clackamas County Comprehensive Plan.











Coordination and Partners

- The focus of this project is on the transportation system in unincorporated areasboth urban and rural-between cities and are home to a variety of unincorporated communities.
- A major theme of the TSP Update is coordination:
 - 10 Urban and Suburban Cities within the Metropolitan Planning Area
 - Gladstone, Happy Valley, Johnson City, Lake Oswego, Milwaukie, Oregon City, Rivergrove, Tualatin, West Linn, and Wilsonville.
 - 5 Rural Cities outside the Metropolitan Planning Area
 - Barlow, Canby, Estacada, Molalla and Sandy.

Transportation System Plan Update

- Interstates and Oregon Department of Transportation (ODOT) Routes
 - Including I-5 and I-205; US 26, 35, 99E, 211, 212, 213, and 224.























Looking Ahead: Public Advisory Committee
