

ClackGO Kit Checklist

(Based on Red Cross Survival Kit Supplies list)

Being prepared means being equipped with the proper supplies you may need in the event of an emergency or disaster. Keep your supplies in an easy-to-carry emergency preparedness kit that you can keep at home and take with you in case you must evacuate.

What do you need in your GO kit?

At a minimum, you should have the basic supplies listed below.

☐ Water: one gallon per person, per day (3-day	☐ Multi-purpose tool
supply recommended for evacuation)	☐ Sanitation and personal hygiene items
☐ Food: non-perishable, easy-to-prepare items, and a can opener (3-day supply	☐ Copies of personal documents
recommended for evacuation)	☐ medication list and pertinent
☐ Blankets or sleeping bags	medical information
☐ Frozen cold packs or water bags/bottle to	☐ proof of address
keep food and medicine cold until you can get ice or refrigeration	☐ deed/lease to home
☐ Flashlight or headlamp	☐ identification, including passports, birth certificates, and state issued ID
☐ Battery-powered or hand-crank radio	☐ insurance policies
☐ Battery-powered watch or clock	☐ financial records
☐ Extra batteries for all supplies, including for medical equipment and oxygen tanks	☐ Cell phone with chargers, including a car and/or solar charger
☐ First aid kit	☐ Family and emergency contact information

☐ Extra cash	☐ Emergency blanket
☐ Printed map(s) of your neighborhood and area	
After you gather those basic supplies for your kit, add unique things each member of your family may need, such as:	
 ☐ Medical supplies (if applicable): such as hearing aids with extra batteries, glasses, contact lenses, syringes, etc. ☐ Medications (if applicable): 7-day supply 	☐ Baby supplies (bottles, formula, baby food, diapers)
	☐ Games and activities for children
	☐ Two-way radios
☐ Pet supplies (if applicable):	☐ Extra set of car keys and house keys
