The unit's primary responsibilities include maintaining public and internal dashboards, collecting and reporting performance data, conducting crime analysis, and evaluating the effectiveness of the Clackamas County Sheriff's Office programs and procedures.

Additionally, the SAU prepares annual reports and responds to public and internal requests for data. By leveraging data-driven insights, the unit empowers leadership to make informed decisions, enhances operational efficiency, and strengthens public transparency and accountability.

The SAU's work directly supports public safety efforts by improving resource allocation, addressing emerging challenges, and ensuring that programs are aligned with community needs and the Sheriff's Office priorities.

Each year, NACo recognizes counties for innovations that modernize county government and improve vital services for residents. Programs are judged on such criteria as:

- Effectiveness
- Innovation
- Measurable results
- Enhanced resident participation and understanding of government services

NACo provides services and support to the nation's 3,069 counties, with a membership that represents more than 80 percent of the country's population. NACo's mission is to help strengthen and ensure the health, safety, and vibrancy of counties across America by advancing and promoting county priorities, as well as innovative programs and policies.
