EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Clackamas County Public Health Division (CCPH), in partnership with Social Services, Behavioral Health, and Health Centers divisions requests approval to apply for the Oregon Health Authority (OHA) Rural Health Transformation (RHT) Catalyst Grant. This funding opportunity supports projects that improve how care is delivered in rural communities through investments in prevention, workforce capacity, and technology.

Clackamas County includes rural communities that experience disparities in access to healthcare services and barriers to preventive and behavioral health care. The proposed project will focus on improving access and care coordination for priority populations in rural areas through a scalable, cross-sector model that integrates public health, social services, health centers and behavioral health resources.

In alignment with OHA RHT priorities, CCPH will implement a targeted intervention that will include:

- Expanding access to preventive and/or behavioral health services in rural communities
- Enhancing care coordination and service navigation across systems
- Leveraging data and/or technology to improve access, service delivery, and outcomes

The project will be designed for rapid implementation and will include clear, measurable outcomes related to access, service utilization, and health outcomes for rural populations. CCPH will

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partner with the behavioral health division, social services, Clackamas County Health Centers, community-based organizations, and regional partners to ensure effective implementation and long-term sustainability beyond the grant period.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff respectfully recommend the Board of County Commissioners approve the grant application for submission to the Oregon Health Authority and authorize Chair Roberts or his designee to sign on behalf of the board.

Oregon's Rural Health Transformation (RHT) plan is the state's implementation of a 5-year federal initiative to drive system-level changes in rural healthcare delivery focused on expanding access, strengthening workforce capacity, modernizing data and technology, and improving long-term outcomes through new, sustainable models of care. Within this framework, Catalyst Grants are competitive, short-term funding opportunities for projects that are ready to launch quickly, align with priority areas (prevention, workforce, or technology), and demonstrate measurable impact for rural populations. Clackamas County Health, Housing, and Human Services intends to apply for a catalyst grant in addition to the direct allocation funds as part of the Rural Health Transformation work happening across the state of Oregon.

No other funding sources are required- however, funding through existing grants and program elements will be used to support the work of the grant and ensure alignment across public health/social services/health centers/behavioral health programs and priorities.

3. Does this grant/financial assistance cover indirect costs? If yes, is there a rate cap? If no, can additional funds be obtained to support indirect expenses and what are those sources?

Yes- 15% indirect rate.

4. Does the grant/financial assistance fund an existing program? If yes, which program? If no, what is the purpose of the program?

Yes- this grant will help support a number of public health, social service and behavioral health programs as well as the services offered by health centers, and expand their work into rural communities in Clackamas County. The programs include opioid and substance use prevention, public health emergency services, mental health promotion, behavioral health response, veteran outreach and emergency preparedness.

Organizational Capacity:

1. Does the organization have adequate and qualified staff? If no, can staff be hired within the grant/financial assistance funding opportunity timeframe?

All divisions have adequate and qualified staff to manage the grant and move certain components forward, however, select projects within the grant application require additional temporary staff (3 FTE total), which will be leveraged through subcontracted partners.

These positions include a community paramedic through AMR, a care coordinator through The Father's Heart, and a veteran outreach coordinator that will work with social services. These staff can be hired within the funding time frame and will be limited duration.

2. Are there partnership efforts required? If yes, who are we partnering with and what are their roles and responsibilities?

Yes- public health will be partnering with social services, health centers and behavioral health to expand mental and physical health services and access into rural communities. All divisions will act as co-applicants and submit one unified proposal, aligned with the grant outcomes and metrics set by OHA and CMS. External partners will include AntFarm, Orchard Health, rural EMS partners, The Father's Heart and LoveOne.

3. If this is a pilot project, what is the plan for sun setting the project and/or staff if it does not continue (e.g. making staff positions temporary or limited duration, etc.)?

The RHT catalyst grants last for 5 years total. As no new/temporary staff are being hired within the division, sunsetting staffing is not a concern with this grant. All other preexisting FTE providing project support from within H3S will be funded via existing infrastructure.

4. If funded, would this grant/financial assistance create a new program, does the department intend for the program to continue after initial funding is exhausted? If yes, how will the department ensure funding (e.g. request new funding during the budget process, supplanted by a different program, etc.)?

This grant would not create a new program- it will help enhance our existing services and expand H3S work directly into rural communities. Key components of our rural community engagement and service delivery will be built into existing program elements and operations as much as possible. We fully intend to craft a continuity of services and programs with the key communities identified in this grant after the funding period ends, though with current funding and uncertain financial prospects at the end of the grant period.

Performance will be evaluated via the quarterly/annual reports. CMS and OHA will use the reports to evaluate compliance and determine funding for the subsequent budget periods. Each project within the grant proposal will have it's own set of metrics and outcomes to report on and data specific to individual projects will be collected and analyzed as part of project evaluation.

3. What are the fiscal reporting requirements for this funding?

Financial reporting will include expenditure by initiative and use of funds, to be reported both quarterly and annually.

This funding opportunity aligns with the Public Health Division's goals to reduce health disparities, strengthen prevention and early intervention services, and improve system coordination across public health, healthcare, and community-based partners. By focusing on rural communities, the Catalyst Grant enables public health, social services, and behavioral health to implement innovative, community-informed solutions that expand access, enhance workforce capacity, and modernize service delivery. This directly supports H3S's strategic initiative of equitable access, integrated services, and meaningful community engagement.

2. Who, if any, are the community partners who might be better suited to perform this work?

While the success of our work in rural communities is not possible without the support of key partners, there is no partner or organization better suited to meet the objectives of the RHT catalyst grant. Clackamas County can provide an array of key services and supports, informed by data and made possible with our wide reach of community partnerships.

3. What are the objectives of this funding opportunity? How will we meet these objectives?

The Rural Health Transformation (RHT) Catalyst Grant aims to support projects that improve how care is delivered in rural communities by expanding access to services, strengthening workforce capacity, and enhancing the use of data and technology to improve health outcomes. Clackamas County will meet these objectives by implementing a cross-sector intervention focused on improving access to preventive and behavioral health services in rural areas. This will include reviving public health's mobile services work, expanding the community paramedicine program and Project Hope, and partnering with behavioral health and social services to expand mental health services and access.
