STATEMENT OF RIGHTS

1. Prior to the Hearing. You have the right to make the following requests:

- (A) You can request the opportunity to review public records and talk to County Staff about the violations or request a subpoena for that purpose if the County does not allow you to do so.
- (B) You can request that the Hearings Officer postpone the hearing for good cause by writing the Hearings Officer at least 7 calendar days prior to the scheduled hearing date.
- (C) You can request that the Hearings Officer decide the matter based exclusively on written materials from the parties or conduct the hearing by phone.

2. Procedure. The hearing will be governed by general rules of procedure designed to allow you to hear and confront the evidence against you, and for you to present evidence favorable to you. You are not required to present any evidence; the burden is on the County to establish by a preponderance of evidence that a violation exists or existed. Either party may, at their own expense, obtain an attorney, to represent that at the hearing. If you wish to be represented by an attorney, they need only notify the County and the Hearings Officer in writing of their intent to appear on your behalf. The County will present evidence first, and then you may question that evidence. You may then present your own evidence, if you wish, and the County may question your evidence. Testimony by witnesses is evidence. The Hearings Officer may inquire into any facts that are relevant to the hearing and may question parties or witnesses about the case. Evidence of a type commonly relied upon by reasonably prudent persons in the conduct of their serious affairs shall be admissible.

3. Record of Proceedings. An audio record will be made of the proceedings when a hearing is conducted. The audio record is available through the Clackamas County Code Enforcement Section and is available to you upon request.

4. Hearings Officer. The Hearings Officer is an independent contractor paid by the County to conduct hearings and render decisions. He/she is not a County employee. His/her function is to preside over the hearing, make a record of proceedings, consider admissible evidence and interpret and apply the law. After the hearing is closed, the Hearings Officer will enter written findings of fact, conclusions of law and any Order deemed proper. If a violation is proven, then the Order may include civil penalties, fines, administrative fees, or may require the respondent to take certain actions, or refrain from certain actions. An Order issued by the Hearings Officer may be a final order or a continuing order. The Hearings Officer Order is the final decision of the County, and may be appealed pursuant to Oregon Law. 5. Right to Recess. If, during the course of the hearing, the Respondent or the County requests a recess or postponement, or additional time to present crucial evidence, the Hearings Officer may allow a continuance of the hearing for good cause. The Respondent may also request that the proceedings be continued after the end of the hearing if the Respondent determines that additional evidence should be brought to the attention of the Hearings Officer.

6. Right to Appeal. The Final Order of the Hearings Officer shall set forth the right of the respondent to appeal any adverse Order. Appeal may be taken pursuant to Section 2.07.130 of the Clackamas County Hearing Officer Code, and Oregon Revised Statute 34.010-34.100. If appeal is taken, the appellant is responsible for all costs of appeal including preparation of transcript.

COMPLAINT AND REQUEST FOR HEARING

I, Kimberly Benthin, Code Enforcement Specialist for Clackamas County, allege the following:

1.

Respondent 's mailing address is PO Box 56744, Portland, OR 97238

2.

The Respondent owns and occupies the address or location of the violations of law alleged in this Complaint 3723 SE Pinehurst Ave, Milwaukie, OR 97267, also known as T2S, R1E, Section 01DD, Tax Lot 01300, and is located in Clackamas County, Oregon. The property is zoned Urban Low Density Residential R-10 Section 315 and is the location of violations asserted by the County.

3.

On or about the 20th day of April 2015 and on or about the 6th day of March 6, 2017, the Respondent violated the following laws, in the following ways:

Respondent violated Chapter 10.03 of the Clackamas County Solid Waste

and Wastes Management Code, Section 10.03.100 by accumulating waste including but not limited to inoperable vehicles, and vehicle parts. This violation is a Priority 2 violation pursuant to the Clackamas County Violation Priorities.

4.

On or about the 26th day of June 2017 the Respondent violated the following laws, in the following ways:

Respondent violated Chapter 10.03 of the Clackamas County Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code, Section 10.03.100 by accumulating waste including but not limited to inoperable vehicles, and vehicle parts. This violation is a Priority 2 violation pursuant to the Clackamas County Violation Priorities.

5.

The Department initiating this procedure is the Code Enforcement Section of the Department of Transportation and Development.


Notice of the violation was given to Respondents in the following manner: Notice of Violation dated April 20, 2015, and Administrative Citation #1530 dated March 6, 2017, and Administrative Citation # 1530-2 dated June 26, 2017. A copy of the notice documents is attached to this Complaint as Exhibits E, K, and N respectively, and incorporated by this reference.

7.

Based on these allegations, petitioner requests that a hearing be set on this matter. Petitioner seeks an Order from the Hearings Officer granting the following relief:

1. Pursuant to Clackamas County Code Section 2.07.090, ordering Respondent to immediately abate the violations and bring the property at issue into compliance with all laws, and permanently enjoining Respondent violating these laws in the future;
2. Pursuant to Clackamas County Code Section 2.07.090, imposing a civil penalty against Respondent for each violation, within the range established by the Board of County Commissioners. Said range for Chapter 10.030 Priority 2 violation being \$500.00 to \$2,500.00 per occurrence as provided by Appendix B to the Clackamas County Code;
3. Pursuant to Clackamas County Code Section 2.07.090, ordering Respondent to pay an administrative compliance fee as provided by Appendix A to the Clackamas County Code; and
4. Pursuant to Clackamas County Code Section 2.07.090, ordering Respondent to reimburse the County for any expense the County may incur in collection of any penalties, fines or fees that may be imposed:
5. Ordering any other relief deemed reasonably necessary to correct the violations.

STATEMENT OF PROOF

History of Events and Exhibits:

January 9, 2015 Exhibit: A, B	Clackamas County received a complaint about an accumulation of waste, and inoperable vehicles under tarps.
January 26, 2015 Exhibit: C	Correspondence regarding the allegations was mailed to the Respondent.
April 16, 2015 Exhibit: D	An inspection of the property was conducted by Code Enforcement Specialist (CES) Kimberly Benthin. Photos were taken during this inspection. Items found on site include inoperable vehicles; items covered in tarps, vehicle parts and miscellaneous items.
April 20, 2015 Exhibit: E	Facts of the alleged violation were reviewed, the solid waste code violation verified, and a Notice of Violation was mailed to the Respondent. The Notice was mailed via first class mail.
June 11, 2015 Exhibit: F	CES Benthin performed a site inspection. An accumulation of waste was found on site. Items found on site include but are not limited to: inoperable vehicles, items covered in tarps, vehicle parts and miscellaneous items.
September 8, 2015 Exhibit: G	The deadline of June 1, 2015 to abate the violation of the Solid Waste Code was not met. A second violation notice with a new deadline of October 1, 2015, was mailed to the Respondent via first class mail.
September 30, 2015 Exhibit: H	Correspondence regarding a new extension to the deadline for compliance was mailed by first class and sent by email to the Respondent. The new deadline was December 1, 2015.

December 2, 2015- January 6, 2016 Exhibit: I	CES Benthin and Respondent exchanged emails regarding progress. A new deadline of February 16, 2016, was set to gain compliance.
February 16, 2017 Exhibit: J	Code Enforcement Specialist Guy Matychuk performed a site inspection. The property remained in a state of violation with inoperable vehicles, and tarped items.
March 6, 2017 Exhibit: K	Citation #1530 issued for the violation of the Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code. It was sent via first class mail to the Respondent. This citation has been paid.
May 2, 2017 Exhibit: L	Respondent sent an email update with photos of progress. CES Benthin replied by email on May 8 th and requested an estimate date of completion. No response was received for the estimated date.
May 10, 2017 Exhibit: M	A site inspection occurred photos were taken, the property was found to remain in violation with numerous inoperable and/or not currently licensed vehicles, miscellaneous items and some vehicles were tarped.
June 26, 2017 Exhibit: N	Citation #3015- 2 issued for the solid waste code violation sent via first class mail. The first-class mail was not returned. This citation has not been paid.
July 6 - October 4, 2017 Exhibit: O	Respondent provided emails stating he had made progress with photos attached.
October 17, 2017 Exhibit: P	An inspection was carried out by Code Enforcement Specialist Mike Boyes the property remained in violation. Inoperable vehicles, tarped covered items and miscellaneous debris remained on site.
July 25, 2017, through February 16, 2021 Exhibit: Q	The subject property remained in a state of violation inspections occurred over time.
December 4, 2024 Exhibit: R	CES Benthin conducted an inspection. The property remained in violation of the solid waste code. Photos were taken during the inspection.

July 31, 2025
Exhibit: S

CES Benthin conducted an inspection and found that items are affecting the roadways. The inspection revealed that there are significantly more items than when inspected in December.

December 9, 2025 This file was prepared for a hearing date to be set.

If the Hearings Officer affirms the County's position that a violation of Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code exists on the subject property, the County would request a Final Order be issued.

The County requests:

- That it be noted that Citation No. 1530 for \$75.00 for the Priority 2 Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code violation, was paid by the Respondent.
- Assessment of a civil penalty of \$500.00 and up to \$2,500.00 for Priority 2 Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code violation for date cited March 6, 2017.
- Payment of Citation No. 1530-2 for \$400.00 for the Priority 2 Solid Waste Code violation. This citation was not paid.
- Assessment of a civil penalty between \$500.00 and \$2,500.00 for the Priority 2 Solid Waste Code violation for date cited June 26, 2017.
- Assessment of an administrative compliance fee calculated at the rate of \$75.00 per month starting February 2015 through end of June 2025, subtotaling \$9,675.00. The County is requesting a reduction of \$6,150.00 in the assessed administrative compliance fee due to 82 months of inactive code enforcement activity and is seeking a total administrative compliance fee of \$3,525.00, for this period.
- Assessment of an administrative compliance fee calculated at the rate of \$100.00 per month starting July 2025 through date of abatement or date of final order subtotaling \$600.00.
- The County requests that reimbursement be ordered for any expense the County incurs in collection of these monies.
- If the violations are not abated the County may request authorization for further enforcement action including to proceed to Circuit Court.
- The County requests the Hearing's Officer to permanently enjoin the Respondent from violating these laws in the future.

Should mitigating factors be presented in the hearing, which the Hearings Officer determines warrants a Continuing Order, the County would request:

That not more than 30 days of the date of the Continuing Order,

- The Respondent bring the property into compliance with the Solid Waste and Wastes Management Code Chapter 10.03. It is requested the Respondent schedule an onsite inspection with Code Enforcement Staff to verify that any remaining tarped items are not covering waste and are compliant with the code.

- The County will submit a Post Hearing Status Report. The report may include fines and fees as recommended above. The report will be sent to the Compliance Hearings Officer and to the Respondent.



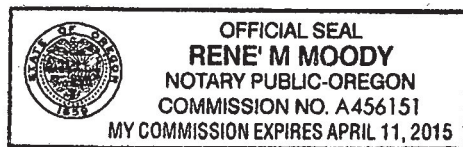

This letter is in follow up to a conversation with John Bird held on February 4 and March 26, 2015. It was agreed upon the above referenced property would be made compliant with the Solid Waste and Waste Management Code **no later than April 15, 2015**. This property has been in violation of the Solid Waste and Waste Management Code Chapter 10.03 several times in the past. Recently a representative from the Code Enforcement Section conducted an inspection of the subject property.

During this inspection, it was confirmed that large areas are tarped, miscellaneous tools, tractor tire and vehicles remain on site, a large yellow pickup full of scrap metal is also on site, all which appear to be in violation of the Clackamas County Code.

To abate the solid waste violation involving **all** inoperable and/or non-currently licensed vehicles which includes motorcycles, boats and/or boat trailers, and/or motor-homes, travel trailers **no later than June 1, 2015**:

- **Remove** inoperable and/or non-currently licensed vehicles from the property, **and/or**;
- **Render** inoperable and/or non-currently licensed vehicles operable and licensed to persons currently residing on the subject property, **and/or**;
- **Place** inoperable and/or non-currently licensed vehicles owned by persons currently residing on the subject property inside a permitted structure, **and/or**;
- **Screen** up to two inoperable and/or non-currently licensed vehicles from view from the road and surrounding properties in accordance with the minimum screening requirements of the code (see Chapter 10.03.060 (C).enclosed)

This accumulation of solid waste causes a condition of unsightliness and is a safety and health hazard and, therefore, violates the Clackamas County Code, Chapter 10.03, Solid Waste and Waste Management. Your cooperation is solicited to store out of sight all articles of solid waste that you wish to keep and to remove the remainder to an authorized disposal facility. Additionally, all putrescible waste will be stored in a rodent-proof container with a tight-fitting lid and removed to an authorized disposal facility a minimum of **once every seven (7) days**. **Covering solid waste with a tarp does not remove the items from violation.**

Remove all solid waste place those items you wish to keep within a permitted structure or screen from view per Ch.10.03.060 C. **no later than June 1, 2015:**

Unpaid fines, administrative fees, civil penalties and abatement costs may be recorded as a lien against property owned by any of the parties either jointly or separately.

Also, be advised that non-compliance with a Hearings Officer's Order may result in the matter being referred to County Counsel for legal action in Circuit Court which may result in additional penalties or other sanctions.

Finally, recurrences of abated violations will result in the issuance of a citation without prior notice.

 2. Placing a tarp, plastic, cloth, or similar screening apparatus over or around solid waste or wastes that is stored in a utility trailer, pickup truck, semi-trailer or similar device for purposes of keeping it out of sight from the road or surrounding properties.
 3. Constructing a tire fence for any purpose.
 4. Storing waste tires except as permitted pursuant to OAR Chapter 340.
 5. Storing putrescible waste, whether it is visible or not visible from the road or adjacent properties, that is not kept in a rodent proof container with a tight fitting lid, and not removed from the property to an authorized disposal facility within seven (7) days.
 6. Composting which causes offensive odors, or creates a health hazard, or which is capable of attracting or providing food for potential disease carriers such as birds, rodents, flies and other vectors.
 7. Storing, collecting, maintaining, or displaying any licensed or unlicensed special vehicle or equipment that is immobile, inoperable, partially dismantled or dismantled, dilapidated, or fire damaged and is visible from the road or surrounding properties.
 8. Storing, collecting, maintaining, or displaying a mobile home or trailer house, which is dilapidated or partially dismantled, or fire damaged, and is visible from the road or surrounding properties.
 9. Storing, collecting, maintaining or displaying: residential, commercial and industrial appliances, equipment and furniture; vehicle parts; tires; scrap metal, or any other useless, unwanted or discarded material, or other similar non-putrescible solid waste or wastes, that is visible from the road or surrounding properties.
 10. Storing, collecting, maintaining or displaying any antique, classic, race car or collectible vehicle that is inoperable and is visible from the road or surrounding properties.
 11. Storing any inoperable vehicle or vehicles unless said vehicle or vehicles are housed within a permitted structure or development, except up to two vehicles per premise may be stored behind a sight-obscuring screen, in accordance with 10.03.060 C, and shall not be visible from the road or surrounding properties. For purposes of this Subsection 11, two or more contiguous tax lots that are under common ownership shall be considered one premises.

12. When commercial, industrial, multi-family or residential developments that use a compactor or compactors for on-site waste management, do not keep the areas around the compactor free of solid waste and debris, and washed down on a regular basis.

C. Any sight obscuring screen used to abate a solid waste nuisance shall consist of one of the following options:

1. Construct a wood fence unpainted or painted with neutral or earth tone colors of which the upright posts shall consist of a decay resistive material a minimum of four (4) inches in diameter and anchored a minimum of two (2) feet below ground level. There shall be a maximum post separation of eight (8) feet. The railings shall be a minimum of 2-inch by 4-inch lumber with the 4-inch side attached vertically to the posts. The attached vertical or horizontal fence boards shall be set with a maximum separation of 1/4 inch.
2. Construct a metal fence consisting of chain link or woven fabric with metal upright posts anchored a minimum of two (2) feet below ground level with metal railings and connectors. Water and insect resistive wood or plastic slats shall be inserted in the chain link or woven fabric, with a maximum separation of 3/8 inch between slats.
3. Construct a combination fence consisting of metal sheeting attached to wood framing as defined in Section C 1 above, or durable metal framing, which is painted a neutral or earth tone color.
4. Construct a wall consisting of solid material, built of concrete, masonry, brick, stone or other similar materials or combinations thereof.
5. Construct an earthen berm consisting of dirt, soil, sand, clay or any combination thereof and shall be planted with grass and/or ornamental plantings and shall be maintained at all times.
6. Plant a hedge consisting of evergreen plantings or other ornamental plantings a minimum of six (6) feet in height, planted not more than two (2) feet on center and which is maintained at all times.

In addition to the minimum fencing requirements, wood, metal, masonry fences or combination thereof greater than six (6) feet in height are subject to County review pursuant to the Oregon State Uniform Building Code, and all earthen berms are subject to County review pursuant to the County's Grading and Excavation Chapter.

For purposes of this chapter, no sight obscuring screen shall be located, placed, constructed or installed contrary to the Clackamas County Zoning and Development Ordinance."

10.03.030 Definitions

"(32). INOPERABLE VEHICLE for the purpose of the Nuisance Abatement provisions of this chapter, shall mean a vehicle designed for use on a public highway which has been left on public or private property thirty (30) days or more and is not currently licensed, or not in operating condition, or which has been extensively damaged, vandalized or stripped, including, but not limited to, missing wheels, tires, motor or transmission. An inoperable vehicle shall not mean an unlicensed operable vehicle or vehicles, which are used on private property for the production, propagation or harvesting of agricultural products grown or raised on such lands. "

"(58). SOLID WASTE OR WASTES shall include all putrescible and non-putrescible waste, including but not limited to, garbage; compost; organic waste; yard debris; brush and branches; land-clearing debris; sewer sludge; residential, commercial and industrial building demolition or construction waste; discarded residential, commercial and industrial appliances, equipment and furniture; discarded, inoperable or abandoned vehicles or vehicle parts and vehicle tires; special

vehicles and equipment that are immobile and/or inoperable, mobile homes or trailer houses which are dilapidated, partially dismantled or fire damaged; manure; feces; vegetable or animal solid and semi-solid waste and dead animals; and infectious waste. Waste shall mean useless, unwanted or discarded materials. The fact that materials which would otherwise come within the definition of solid waste may, from time to time, have value and thus be utilized shall not remove them from the definition. The terms solid waste or wastes do not include:

- a. Environmentally hazardous wastes as defined in ORS Chapter 466.
- b. Materials used for fertilizer or for other productive purposes on land in agricultural operations in the growing and harvesting of crops or the raising of fowl or animals. This exception does not apply to the keeping of animals on land which has been zoned for residential non-agricultural purposes.
- c. Septic tank and cesspool pumping or chemical toilet waste;
- d. For purposes of Section 10.03.140 to 10.03.330 of this chapter, reusable beverage containers as defined in ORS 459A.
- e. Source-separated, principal recyclable materials as defined in ORS 459A and the rules promulgated thereunder and under this chapter, which have been purchased or exchanged for fair market value, unless said principal recyclable materials create a public nuisance pursuant to Section 10.03.060 to 10.03.080 of this chapter.
- f. Applications of industrial sludge or industrial waste by-products authorized through a Land Use Compatibility Statement or Management Plan approval and that have been applied to agricultural lands according to accepted agronomic practices or accepted method approved by the Land Use Compatibility Statement or Management Plan, but not to exceed 100 dry tons per acre annually.
- g. Stabilized municipal sewage sludge applied for accepted beneficial uses on land in agricultural, non-agricultural, or silvicultural operations. Sludge derived products applied for beneficial uses on land in landscaping projects. “

Correspondence was mailed April 20th, (enclosed) that outlined a June 1, 2015 deadline. On June 2nd I received an email from you asking to postpone the inspection, requesting an extension to the deadline and to meet with me at the County offices on the next day. I sent an email in response.

I have not heard from you since that date. This property has been in violation of the Solid Waste and Waste Management Code Chapter 10.03 several times in the past. The most recent inspection reveals that numerous tarped structures, miscellaneous tools, vehicle parts and vehicles remain on site all which appear to be in violation of the Clackamas County Code.

Please bring the property into compliance with the Solid Waste and Waste Management Code Chapter 10.03 **no later than October 1, 2015**, by removing all solid waste items; those items you wish to keep may be placed within a permitted structure or screened from view in compliance with Ch.10.03.060 C.

I also provided you again the copy of the code regarding tarps and tarp structures. At that time the deadline was the next day, October 1st. We agreed to a new deadline of December 1st.

There are many good people in the world; and I am sure you are one of them. Your character references will not affect nor remedy the solid waste code violation. I would urge you to spend time on abating the solid waste code rather than spending time on gathering character references.

In your email below you have mentioned the progress you have made and that some of the empty tarp structures have been dismantled. I will drive by and see what progress has been made. If I can confirm progress has been made on site I will send you a notice of a deadline extension.

I do understand, as we discussed on September 30th, the magnitude of this project to gain compliance for your property. It is also clear that you have methods to deal with the items, craigslist, sales, garage sales, storage, etc. Please continue to work on this issue so that it is permanently resolved.

Let me know if you have any questions. I will conduct a site inspection soon and get back to you.

Hi Kimberly,

First, my apologies. I had planned to send this to you on 30 November, but I had a reschedule on the sale of a liftgate that I had posted on craigslist from the afternoon to 8:30 am. I was anxious to get rid of it, so I agreed to the time. That gave me only 2 1/2 hours of sleep, so by the time I sat down to compose this, I was exhausted.

Second, thanks for the clarification on the tent structures. I hadn't looked at the code closely enough to see that it had changed in the years since the last time your office contacted me.

I feel like I didn't make all that great of an impression the last time we met. A friend suggested that I give you a little background on myself.

I live by myself. When my girlfriend was still living here, I never realized just how much free time splitting the household responsibilities gave me, and just how many household responsibilities that there are.

I have been an aircraft mechanic for United Airlines for 31 years. In all that time, I have worked during dayshift hours approximately 8 months, the rest has been on the off shift. My current schedule is 4:45 pm to 3:15 am on an 8 day week, with rotating days off (days off change forward by 1 day each week). I try to get to bed by 5:00-5:30 am, and get out of bed between 11:00 am and noon. I keep roughly the same hours on my days off. On my work days, it is difficult to interact with a world that works 9 to 5, and to get things done due to the time constraint of going to work. My schedule also makes it more difficult when working around the house when I am off. My most productive hours are usually the ones that I have to be the quietest because of the time of night. I have been on this schedule for so long that I am able to work around it for the most part.

As far as my property goes, I had been slowly reducing what I had since approximately spring of 2014, but it wasn't at the top of my list. Sadly, I was still in Cover-and Forget mode. Most of what I had collected was secured in the tent structures that I didn't ever look inside of, so I kind of forgot about it (out of sight, out of mind). As a result, just what was directly in front of me became what I was getting rid of. When your office contacted me in February, I made cleaning the yard my number one priority. I decided one of the ways to do this was to have a garage sale, so I opened up the tents to see what I could sell off. I was staggered by what I had. I literally had to sit on the ground. Why I had to have it in the first place baffles me. Why I had to hang on to it for so long baffles me more still. I wasn't doing anything with it, and most likely never would. So it had to go.

When we spoke at the beginning of October, I was confident that I would be able to have the yard cleaned up since I

had vacation in November from the 5th to the 25th. I wasn't certain that you understood though, that it was just me doing the cleanup. I had two friends stop by to help with my first garage sale, but that's been the extent of the help. I rented a storage space on 3 October, and have made great progress with the little stuff. Most of it is now in storage, and out of the yard. I am also uncovering and dismantling the tent structures. No need to leave them standing when they are empty. It was on my list to schedule dinner with a friend on November 17th or 18th to discuss storing a couple of vehicles at his house in Washington until I could get them sold (4 or 5 guys interested in them, but nothing for sure). I had also planned to cut up two other vehicles during that time as well. Things that would make the largest impact on the way the yard looks. Unfortunately, I got sick on the 15th, and am still not quite back up to 100 %.

I realize that it is difficult to convey to you just how much I want this issue permanently resolved Kimberly. I also realize it is difficult from your point of view, when you drive by the house and it looks like no real progress is being made. I can assure you that I am spending nearly all of my available free time on getting this finished. I know that you probably hear that same story from a lot of people, so my friend also suggested I make a list of character references-the people that I talk to almost daily as I am working to get the yard cleaned up. I have a list started, but now that the weather is colder/rainier I am not seeing these people as much I used to. I could send you the partial list now, and update it as I add to it.

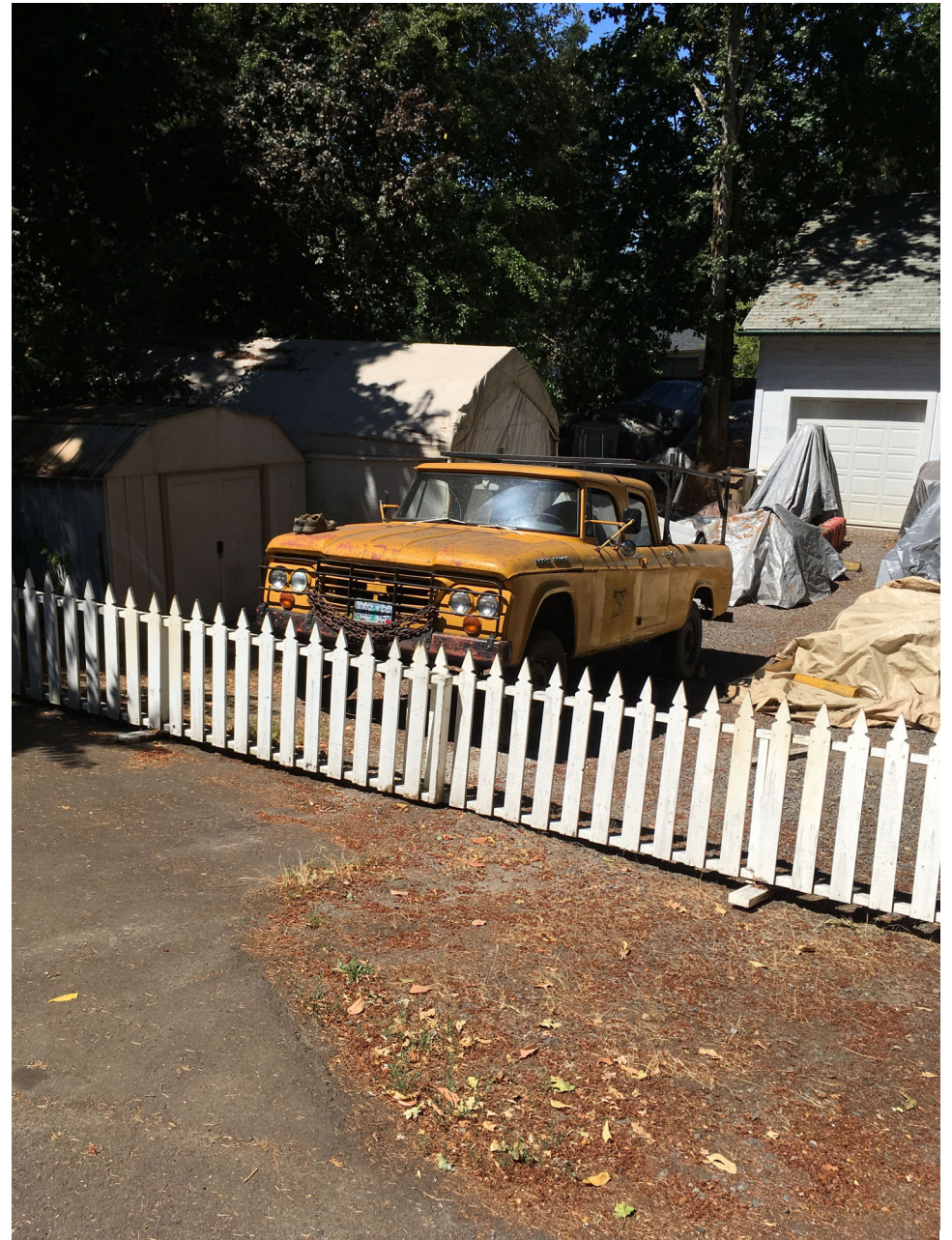

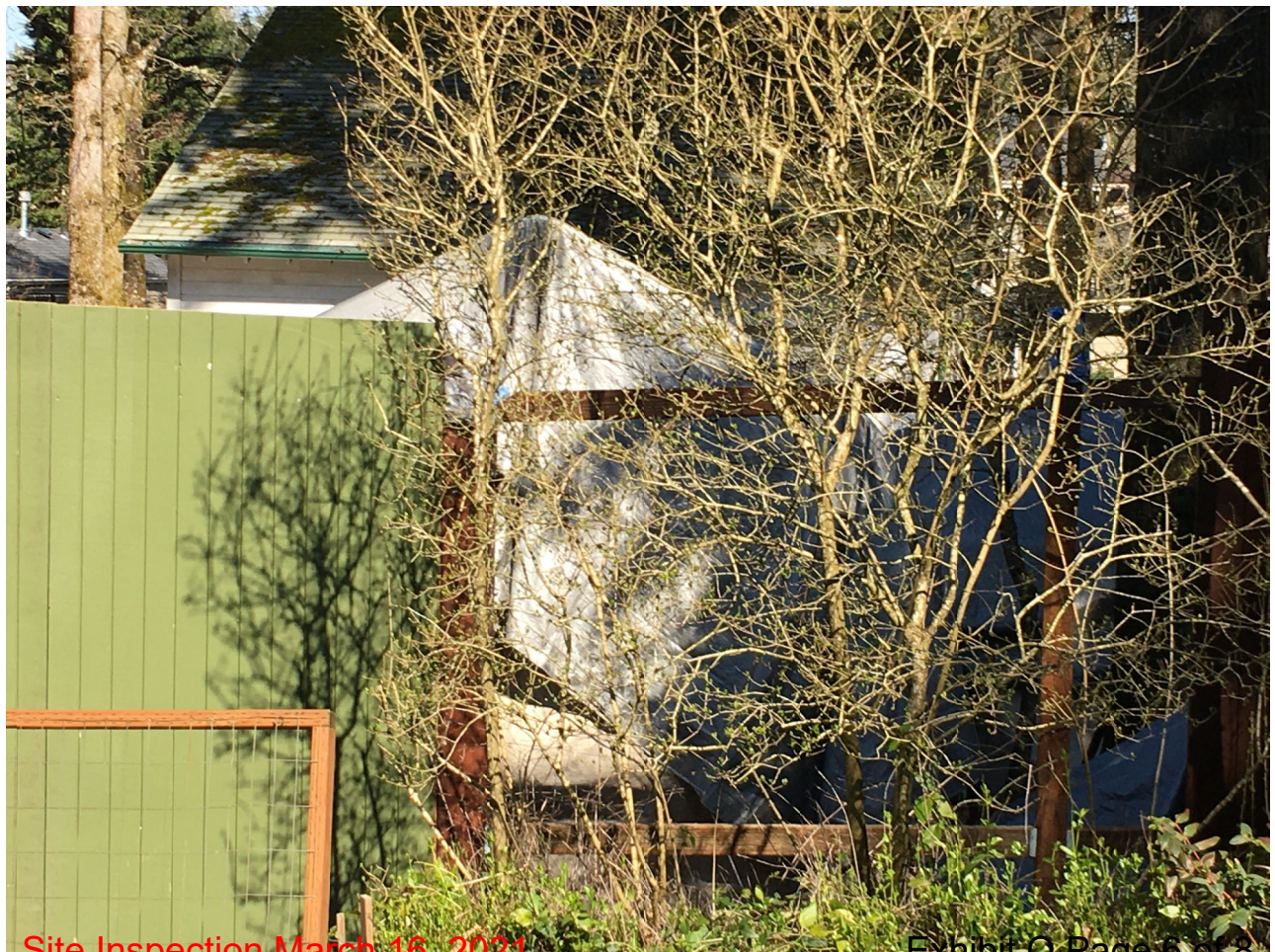
