

November 4, 2025 Special Election by the Numbers



- 125,940 Eligible Voters. 41.25% Turnout.
- 423 ballots (0.8%) challenged & could not be accepted because of signature issues.
- Election cost per eligible voter \$1.69.
- Election personnel cost per 1,000 ballots processed \$744.

Oregon has Closed Party Primary Elections


Oregon had closed party primary elections. To vote in a major political party's (Democratic or Republican) primary nominating election you must be registered with that political party by the **April 28 Voter Registration and Party Choice Deadline**. You can register to vote, update your voter registration, or choose a political party online at oregonvotes.gov.

Voters registered with a minor party or as non-affiliated will receive a ballot with only nonpartisan contests and measures in the May 19, 2026 Primary Election. Ballots will be mailed beginning April 29 and all new voter registrations, and party choices must be submitted by the April 28 deadline.



May 19, 2026 Primary Election: What's on my ballot?

- Federal and State Offices and/or Measures
 - Closed party primaries for US Senate and US House
 - Closed party primaries for Governor, State House and State Senate
 - Nonpartisan primaries for BOLI Commissioner
- Judges
- Nonpartisan County Offices or Measures
 - Commissioners - Position 2, 5 and Position 4 (2 Year Unexpired Term)
 - Assessor and Justice of the Peace
 - Five-Year County Sheriff Public Safety Local Option Levy
- Local Offices or Measures
 - Metro President, Auditor and Councilors (Positions 1 and 2)
 - City, School, and Fire District Measures
- Precinct Committee Person (PCP) Party Elections



May 19, 2026 Primary Election

- April 22 – Voters’ Pamphlets begin to arrive for all Clackamas County households.
- April 28 - Voter Registration and Party Choice Deadline. Office open until 7 p.m.

May 19, 2026 Primary Election - Updates

- The primary election is a county-wide election. All registered voters will receive their ballots by May 7.
- Happy Valley Vote Center at the library will be open May 4 – May 19 for this election.



May 19, 2026 Primary Election

- May 12 – Recommended last day to mail back voted ballot.
- May 19 – Ballots must be mailed with a postmark or received in an Official Ballot Drop Site by 8 p.m.

Twenty-six Official Ballot Drop Sites

Twenty-six Official Ballot Drop Sites will be open April 29 – May 19 at 8 p.m.

New - Oak Lodge Library/Concord Community Center and ColtonTel have a drive-up drop site installed in the parking lot.

Sign up for Track Your Ballot. Receive alerts via text, phone, or email. Know when your ballot is mailed to you. After you vote and return your ballot, be alerted when it has been accepted for counting. Sign up at www.clackamas.us/elections/track-your-ballot



Equity and Inclusion

Every eligible voter has the resources they need to vote easily and without barriers.

- Voter Assistance Technology is available at two voting locations, allowing voters with disabilities to vote independently and protects their right to a secret ballot.
- Two more Official Ballot Drop Sites now have left side drive up access improving access, so that voters do not have to park or get out of their vehicle to return a ballot.

Election Integrity

Our elections are safe and secure; accurate and transparent.

- Upgraded ballot tabulation system to improve processing and lower need for labor-intensive ballot duplication.
- We host candidate open houses and cover common elections administration questions with targeted events for candidates, political parties, city recording staff and other partners.
- Voter registration maintenance is a continuous task done at the county level by four elections staff.
