REQUEST: Informational update only.

BACKGROUND: This memo is a follow up to the April 1, 2025, Issues update.

The Board approved the project, starting with the purchase of 6+ acres from the North Clackamas Parks and Recreation District, at its October 17, 2024, Business Meeting, with an amendment at the November 14, 2024 Business Meeting.

The Board approved the first phase of the subrecipient agreement with Fora Health at its April 10, 2025, Business Meeting. This phase includes the costs for the pre-construction phase of the project and will include designs for both the Clinical and Housing structures.

The Clackamas Public Affairs team continues to pursue funding from the Legislature and has met with the Clackamas Caucus, Governor's staff and testified to the Ways & Means Subcommittee on Capital Construction.

The attached worksheet summarizes activities for the Campus development. Updates are in yellow.

The Recovery Campus will be a multi-functional campus that provides wrap around, person-centered services for individuals with substance use disorders to help them in their recovery journey and return to their communities.

Our Mission, Vision, & Values

Mission

Fora Health Treatment & Recovery provides treatment, care and advocacy for all who are affected by substance use disorder.

Vision

We envision communities where every person affected by substance use disorder has access to the support needed to emerge from this disease. Where healthcare systems become advocates for hope. Where stigma ceases to exist.

Values

Honesty, Empathy, Respect, Inclusion, Unity

Fora's Full Continuum

➤ Outpatient Treatment

Patients receive up to 8 hours of counseling per week. This program offers flexibility through expanded hours, virtual care and telehealth options to support patient success.

➤ Intensive Outpatient Treatment

Patients receive up to 20 hours of therapy a week as indicated by a clinical assessment of their needs. The focus is on in-person care though there is flexibility.

Dual-Diagnosis

All of Fora's patients with co-occurring disorders can access mental health services while in residential and outpatient treatment, including one-on-one counseling, group classes and medication management.

➤ DUII Services

Patients have access to flexible outpatient programs for DUII Diversion and Conviction

Fora's Full Continuum

➤ **Adult Residential Treatment**

Patients receive 24/7 care for SUD and co-occurring mental health disorders. Patients are supported with medication to treat addiction, including methadone if they choose. While in care, patients receive nutrition services led by our dietician and use of Fora's fitness center, art therapy in Fora's art therapy and studio, and outdoor therapy gardens and recreation area. Fora has 70 residential beds.

➤ **Medically Monitored Residential (MMR) Treatment**

Adult residential SUD treatment for those with severe co-occurring medical and/or psychiatric needs. These patients receive close monitoring, on-site medical and psychiatric care, and robust care coordination with primary and specialty care.

➤ **Medically Managed Withdrawal**

Patients spend 1-5 days on-site and receive 24/7 medically supervised support to withdraw from alcohol, opiates, benzodiazepines, and stimulants. Fora has 24 withdrawal management beds.

➤ **Medications to Treat Addiction**

Patients are supported with a prescriber for medications that can reduce withdrawal symptoms and cravings and decrease harms related to drug and alcohol use.

➤ **Family Therapy and Peer Recovery Mentors**

Treatment success rates are substantially higher when patients and their loved ones engage with a family therapist. Peer mentors support, skill-building, and a wealth of activities curated by professionals in recovery.

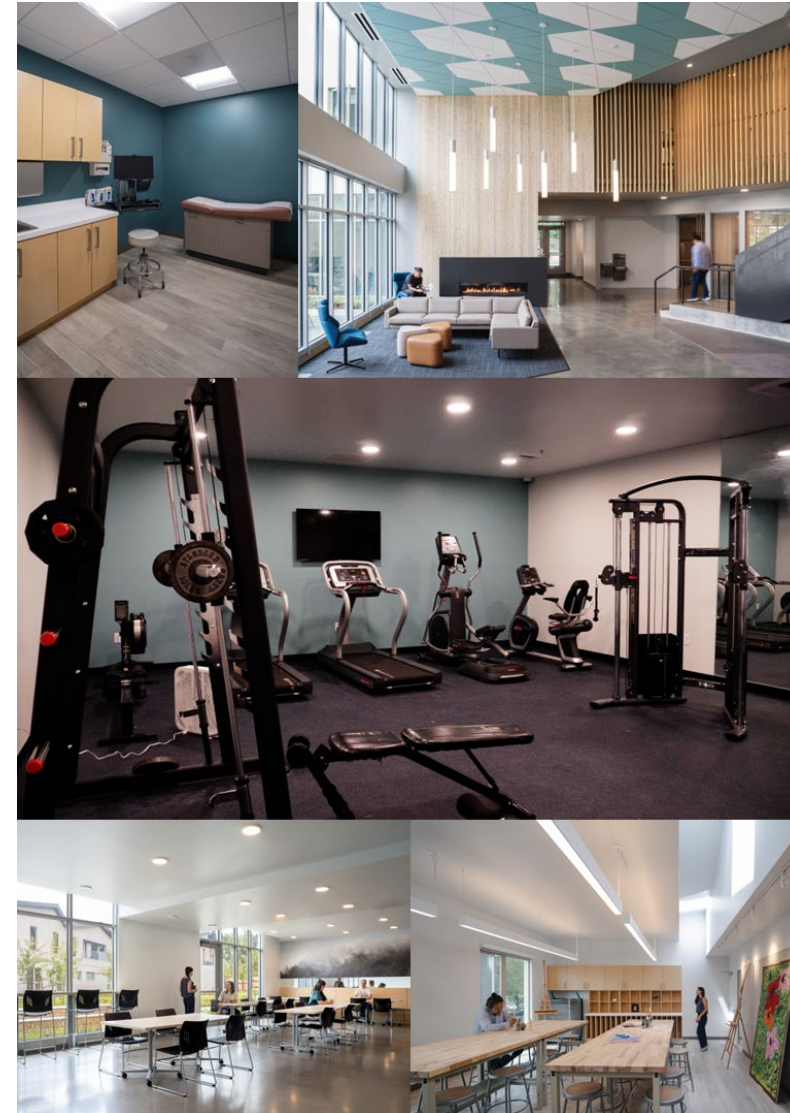

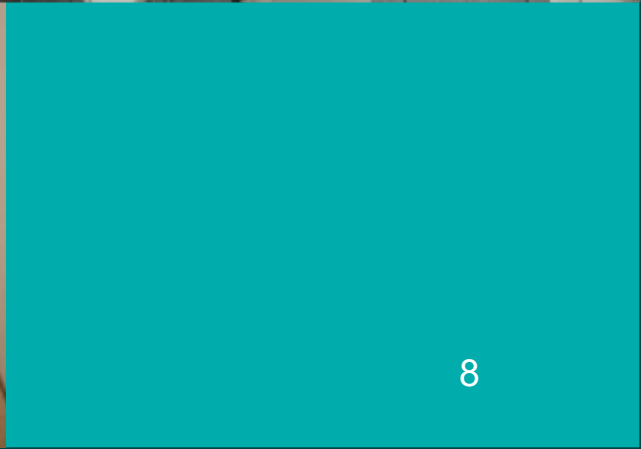

Patients at Fora Health

We serve over **2,100 unique patients** each year!

52% of patients are unemployed when they come to Fora Health.

27% of patients are houseless when they come to Fora and **100% who complete residential treatment have housing when they leave.**

45% of patients had co-occurring mental health conditions

90% of patients were on OHP
