Approval of an Amendment to a Subrecipient Agreement with the Mental Health Association of Oregon for alcohol and drug addiction recovery peer-delivered services. Amendment Value is \$178,720.36 for 6 months. Total Agreement Value is \$702,866.26 for 2 years. Funding is through the Oregon Health Authority. No County General Funds are involved.

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY: The Behavioral Health Division of the Health, Housing, and Human Services Department requests the approval of Amendment #01 to a Federal Subrecipient Grant Agreement with The Mental Health Association of Oregon, dba Mental Health and Addiction Association of Oregon (MHAAO) for Alcohol and Drug Recovery Peer Delivered Services. Services will support Clackamas County residents at risk of substance use and/or abuse or in alcohol and drug recovery. Peer Support Specialists will assist individuals in accessing 12-step programs, support groups, and other resources to develop recovery plans and cultivate community and peer relationships. A selection committee chose MHAAO to provide these peer-delivered services following a Notice of Funding Opportunity (NOFO) conducted in October/November 2023.

The Mental Health and Addiction Association of Oregon is an inclusive, peer-run nonprofit organization committed to promoting self-directed recovery and wellness for all individuals. MHAAO works collaboratively with Behavioral Health to promote a recovery-oriented support system that focuses on hope, choice, personal responsibility, and self-determination.

This Amendment #01 exercises a contemplated extension. The Amendment extends the term of the Agreement twelve (12) months through June 30, 2026, and adds \$178,720.36 for the additional months of services. The maximum Agreement value is increased to \$702,866.26 for twenty-four (24) months of services.

RECOMMENDATION: Staff respectfully requests that the Board of County Commissioners approve this Amendment 01 (11437-01) and authorize Chair Roberts or his designee to sign on behalf of Clackamas County.

Justification for Amendment:

This Amendment #01 is entered into by and between Clackamas County ("COUNTY") and The Mental Health Association of Oregon dba Mental Health & Addiction Association of Oregon ("SUBRECIPIENT") and will become a part of that subrecipient agreement ("Agreement") originally entered by and between the parties on June 27, 2024.

This Amendment #01 extends the term of this Agreement six months through December 31, 2025, and adds \$178,720.36 for the additional months of services. The new maximum value of this Agreement is \$702,866.26.

This Amendment #01 also updates Exhibit A, Subrecipient Scope of Work and Performance Reporting, Exhibit B, Subrecipient Program Budget. Exhibit D, Required Financial Reporting and Payment Request, and Exhibit I, 2 CFR 200.332(a) Required Information.

This amendment is entered into as of July 1, 2025, and continues through December 31, 2025.

Except as amended hereby, all other terms and conditions of the contract remain in full force and effect. The County has identified the changes with "bold/italic" font for easy reference.

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AMEND Agreement, Section 1, Term and Effective Date:

1. Term and Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective on the date it is fully executed and will terminate on June 30, 2025, unless sooner terminated or extended pursuant to the terms hereof. Eligible expenses for this Agreement may be charged during the period beginning January 1, 2024, and expiring June 30, 2025, subject to additional restrictions set forth below and to the exhibits attached hereto, and unless this Agreement is sooner terminated or extended pursuant to the terms hereof. No grant funds are available for expenditures after the expiration date of this Agreement.

TO READ:

1. Term and Effective Date. This Agreement shall become effective on the date it is fully executed and will terminate on *December 31, 2025*, unless sooner terminated or extended pursuant to the terms hereof. Eligible expenses for this Agreement may be charged during the period beginning *January 1*, 2024, and expiring *December 31, 2025*, subject to additional restrictions set forth below and to the exhibits attached hereto, and unless this Agreement is sooner terminated or extended pursuant to the terms hereof. No grant funds are available for expenditures after the expiration date of this Agreement.

AMEND Agreement, Section 4, Grant Funds:

- 4. Grant Funds. COUNTY's funding for this Agreement is the Substance Abuse Prevention and Treatment (SAPT) Block Grant (Assistance Listing Number ["ALN"] #: 93.959) issued to COUNTY by the Oregon Health Authority ("OHA"). The maximum, not to exceed, grant amount COUNTY will pay is \$524,145.90. This is a cost reimbursement grant. The award is conditional upon compliance with the terms herein and disbursements will be made in accordance with the schedule and requirements contained in Exhibit D: Reimbursement Request. Failure to comply with the terms of this Agreement may result in withholding of payment. Funds advanced and unspent must be returned to COUNTY within 30 days of the end of termination period in Section 1 if award conditions are not met.
 - 4.1. Federal Funds: \$498,055.90 in federal funds are provided through the Intergovernmental Agreement for the Financing of Community Mental Health, Addiction Treatment, Recovery & Prevention, and Problem Gambling Services ("IGA"; Agreement No. 44300-00026004) (ALN 93.959) issued to COUNTY by the State of Oregon acting by and through its OHA. The State of Oregon receives funds through the Mental Health Block Grant (MHBG) funds from the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Office of Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration.
 - 4.2. **State Funds:** \$26,090.00 in State funds are provided through the IGA for funding of other items in the program budget.
